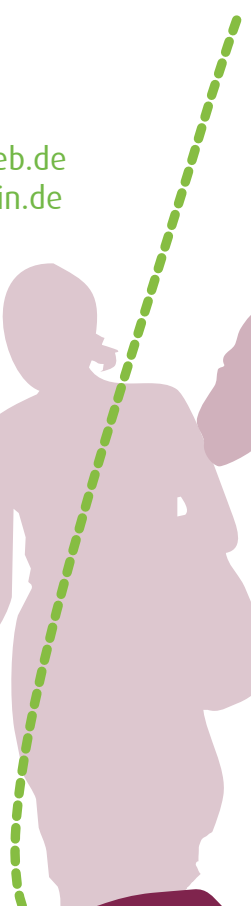
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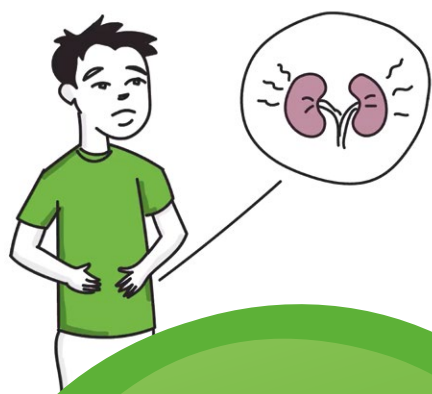

Often tired, Paul could not play with his friends. Till nothing more worked.



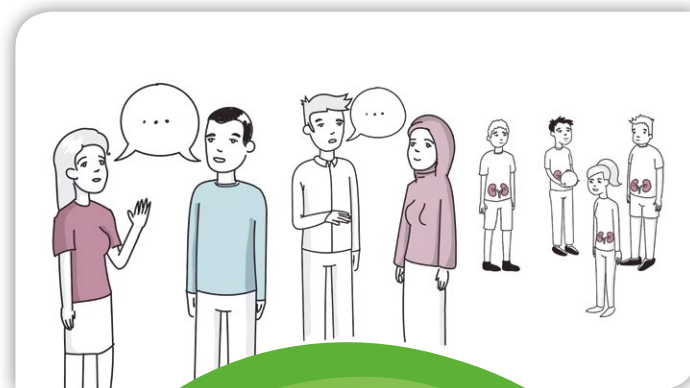

We strongly believe that also very ill children can live a happy life despite their disease.



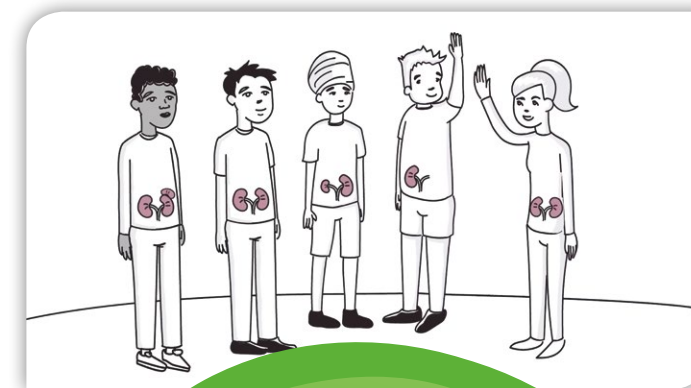
